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Executive Summary

Spring 2018

The undergraduate first-time-in-college enrollment is 293. Seventy-eight percent are from McLennan County. Sixty-four percent of students are female, and fifty-five percent are members of racial or ethnic minority groups. Fifty-two percent of students are in the age range of 18-21 with an overall average age of 25 years at the beginning of the spring term.

Fifty-one percent of students are enrolled in academic majors designed to transfer to a four-year school. Using the state definition of full time (which excludes flex classes), fifty-one percent are full-time students. The overall average credit-hour load excluding flex classes is 10.2. If flex classes are included, the percentage of full-time students is seventy-five percent, and the average credit-hour load is 11.9.

The top 5 areas of study (by CIP Code) are Liberal Arts & Sciences (36.7%), Medical/Clinical Assistant (8.2%), General Studies (7.8%), Business Administration and Management (7.4%), and Business/Commerce, General (4.4%).

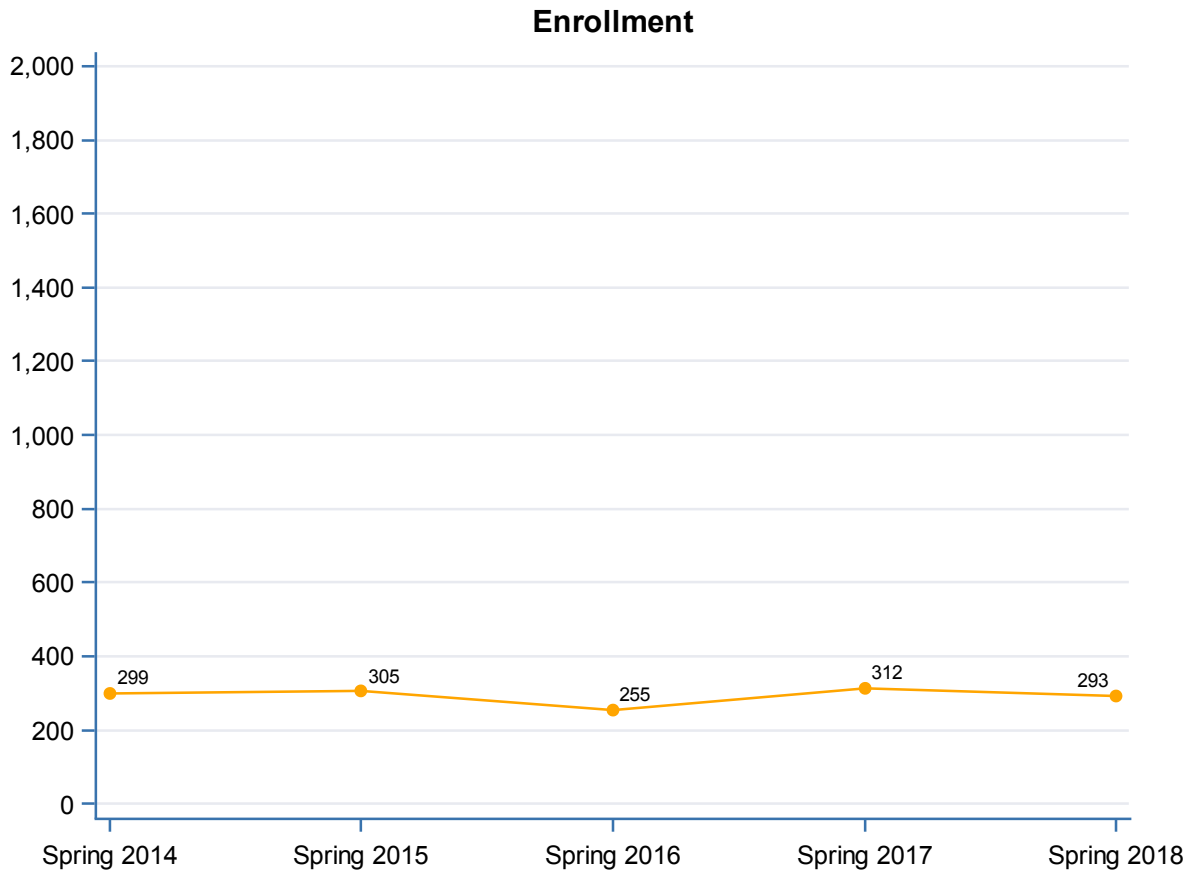
The undergraduate first-time-in-college enrollment is 312. Seventy-seven percent are from McLennan County. Sixty-two percent of students are female, and sixty-seven percent are members of racial or ethnic minority groups. Sixty-five percent of students are in the age range of 18-21 with an overall average age of 23.2 years at the beginning of the spring term.

Sixty-six percent of students are enrolled in academic majors designed to transfer to a four-year school. Using the state definition of full time (which excludes flex classes), fifty-five percent are full-time students. The overall average credit-hour load excluding flex classes is 10.6. If flex classes are included, the percentage of full-time students jumps to sixty-seven percent, and the average credit-hour load is 12.8.

The top 5 areas of study (by CIP Code) are General Studies (31.1%), Liberal Arts & Sciences (19.8%), Business Administration and Management (5.8%), Child Development (5.4%), and Criminal Justice (4.0%).

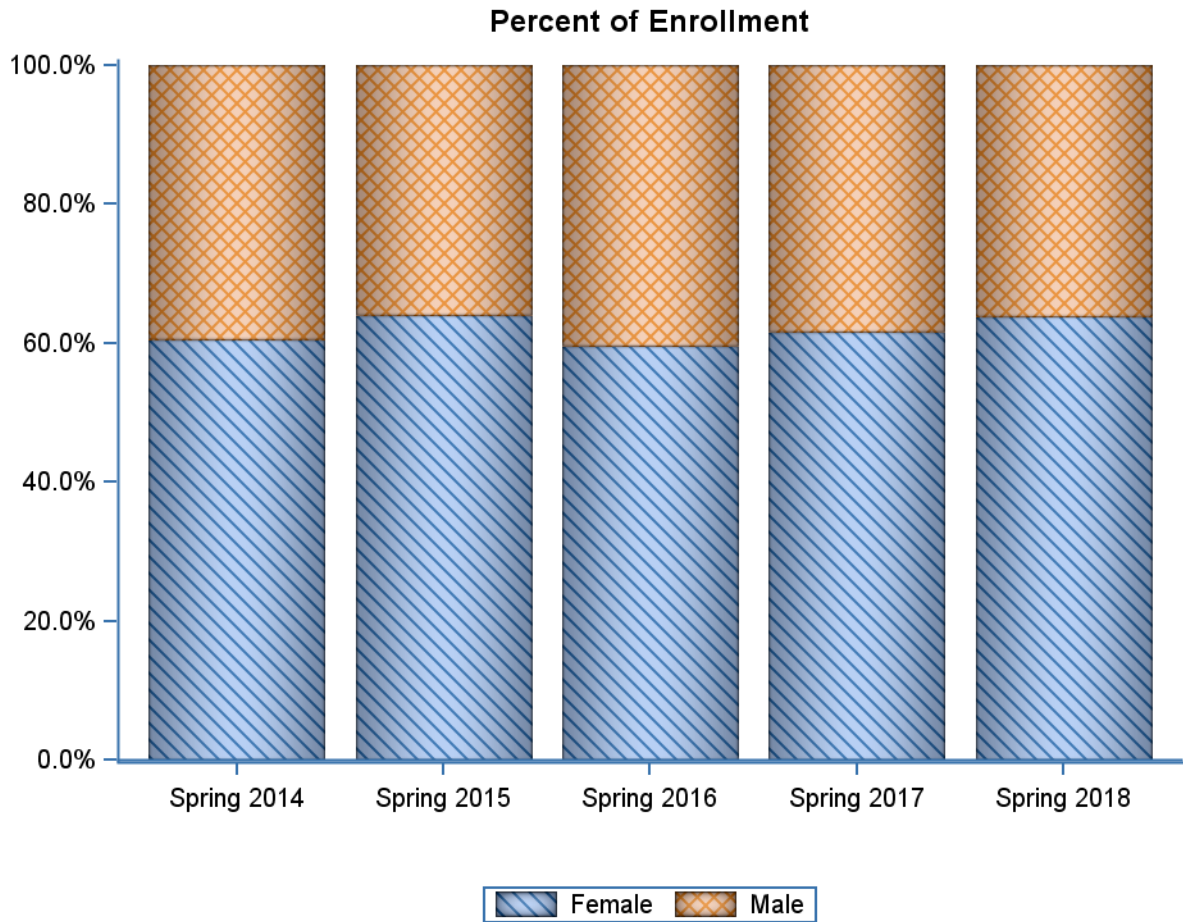

Profile of all First Time in College Students, Spring 2014 to Spring 2018 Gender

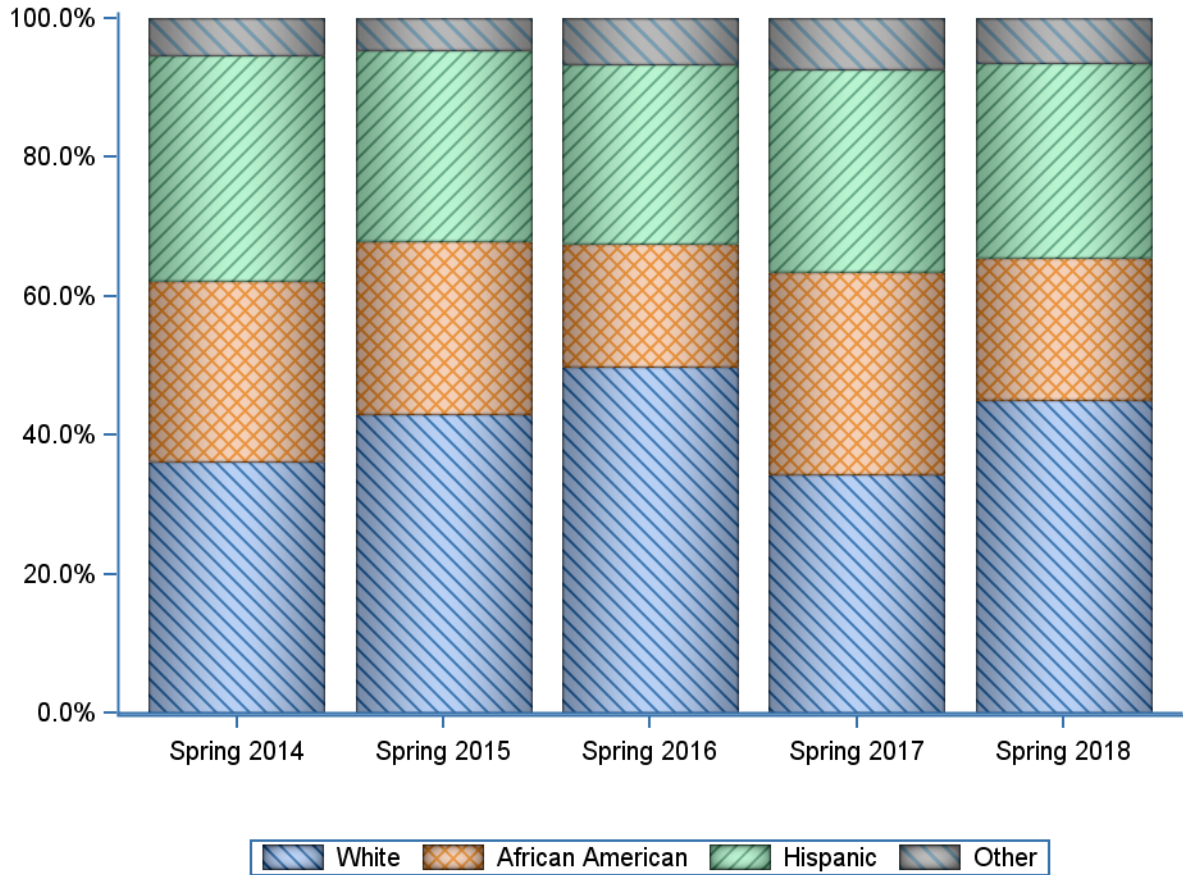

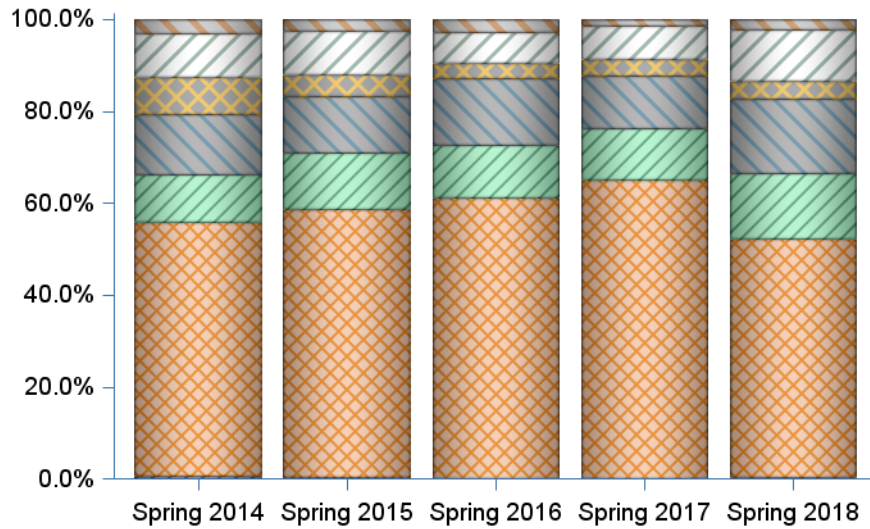
Percent of Enrollment



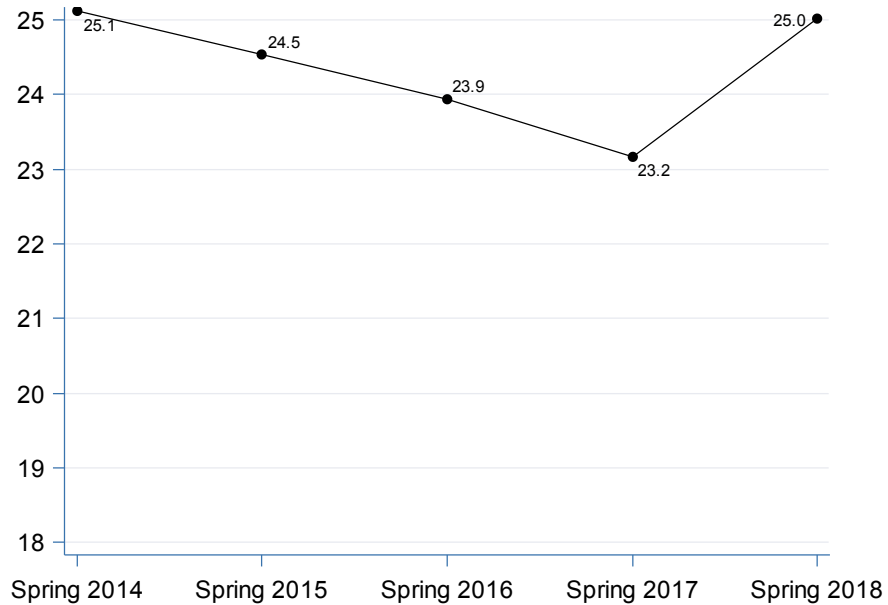

Percent of Enrollment

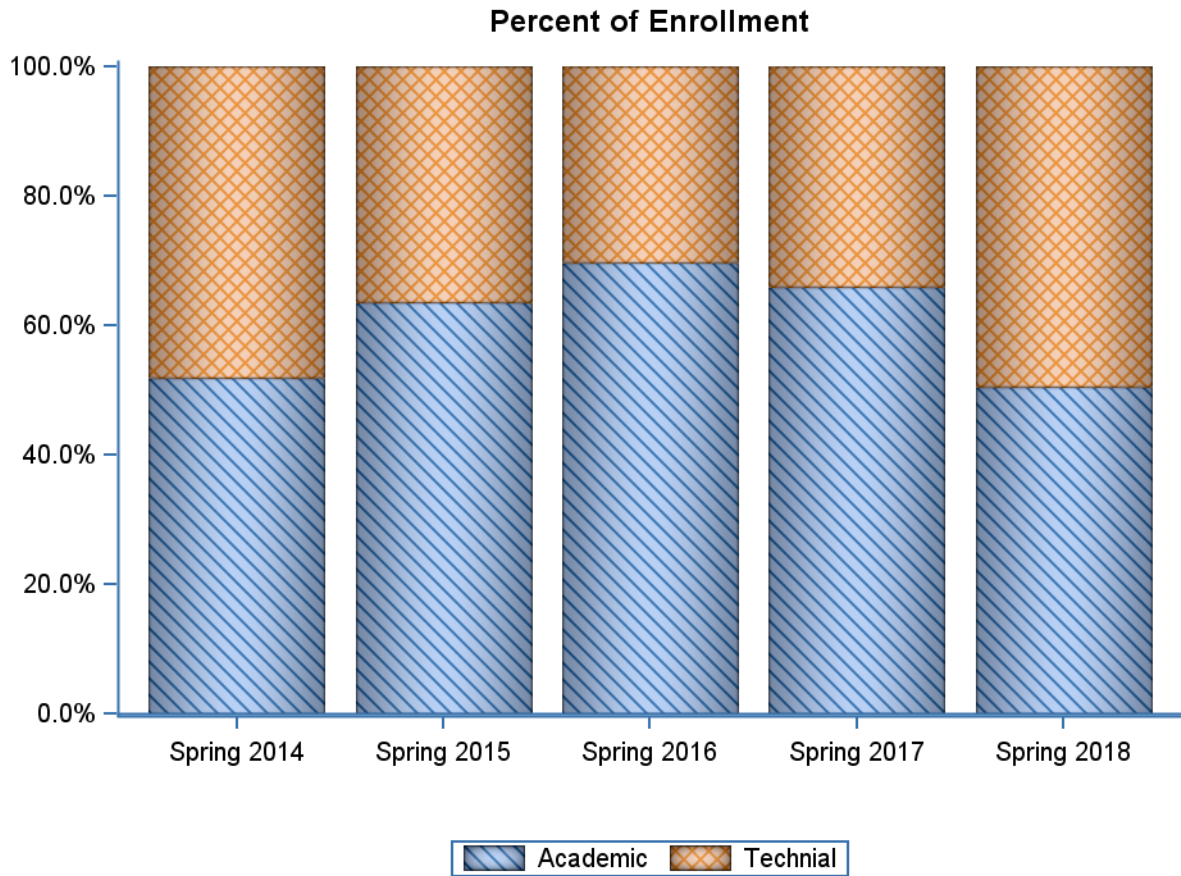


Average Age



Profile of all First Time in College Students, Spring 2014 to Spring 2018 Major Type

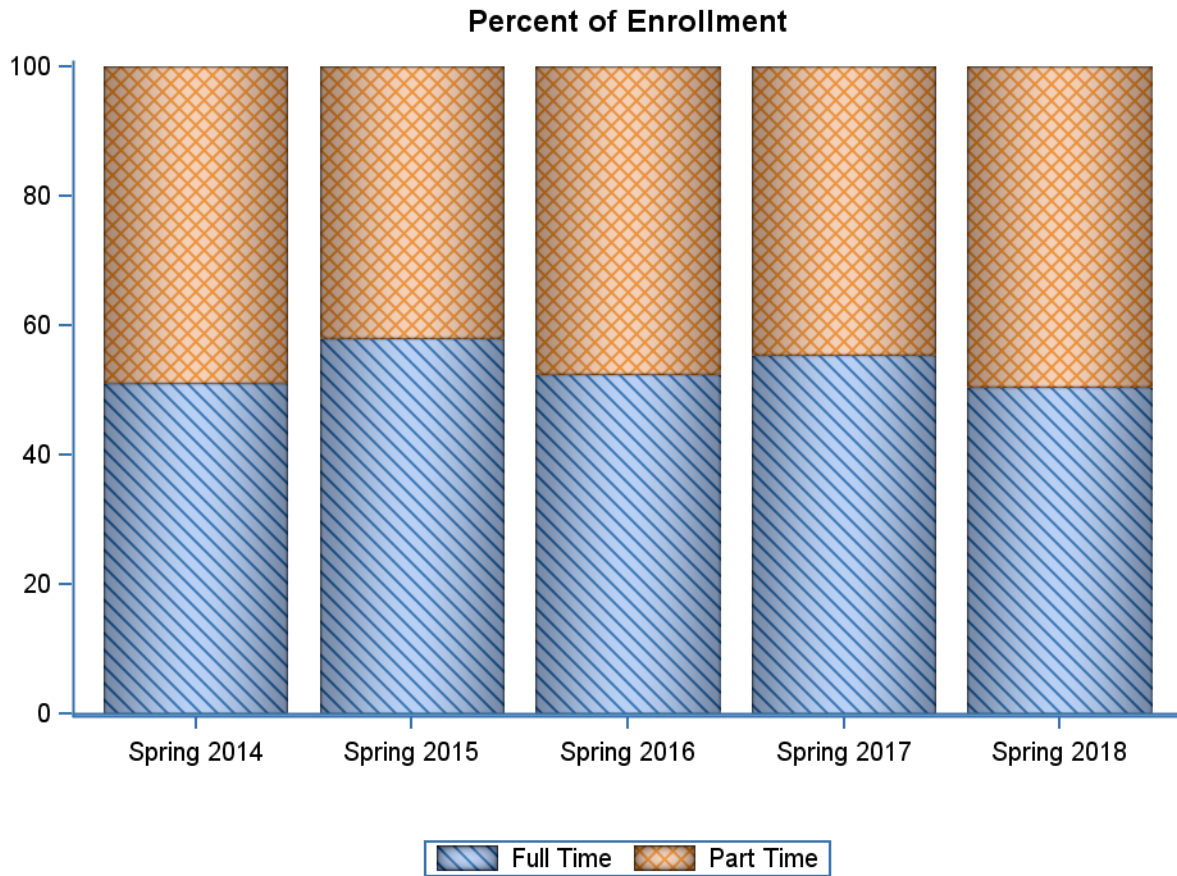

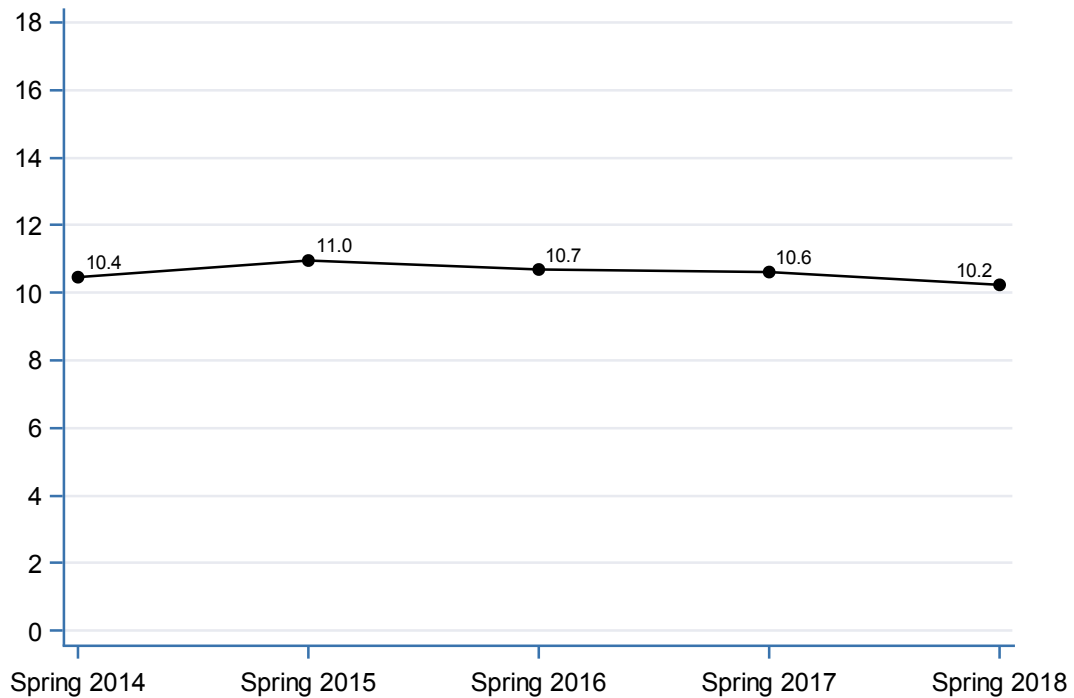

Average Hours

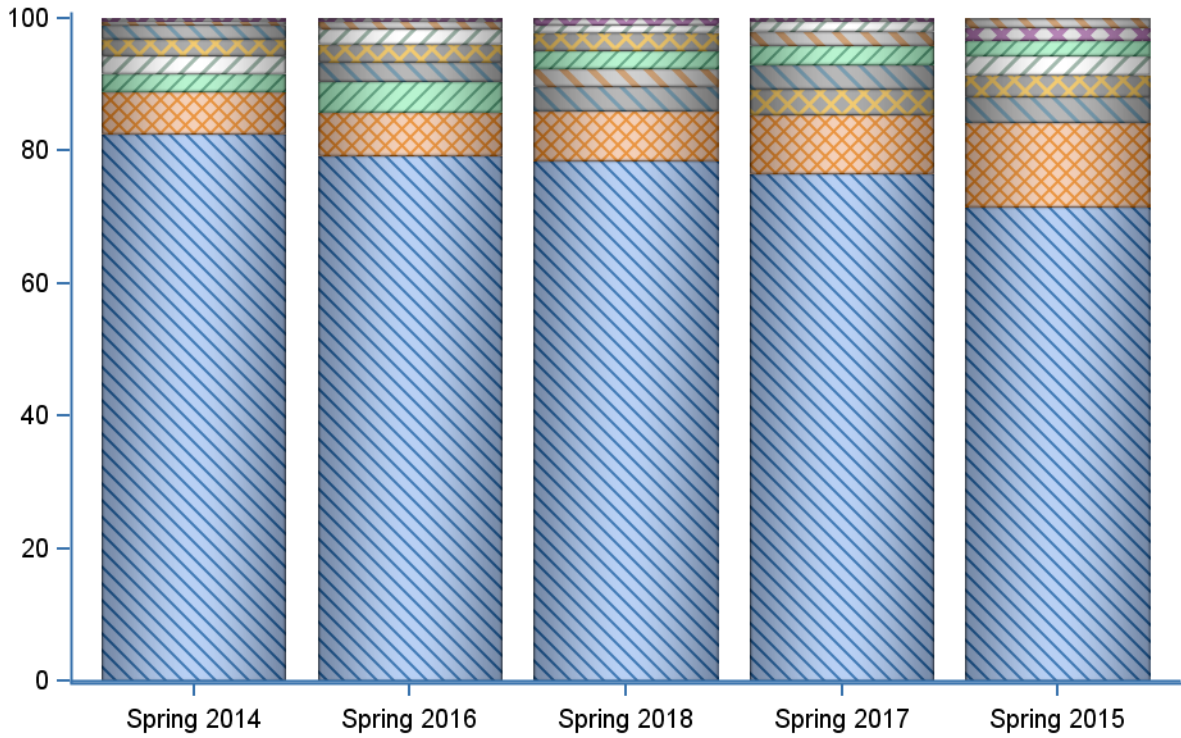
